Assessment Activity 4 – There’s more.....

The club has been selected as the venue for the counties annual championship – a great honour.

Everyone is confident of putting on a good event – but are conscious that with a large crowd anticipated and the level of competition expected to be fierce the potential for injury will be increased.

Task 1

The club decides to discuss health & safety for the event after the next coaching session....the Welfare Officer asking everyone to contribute fully their ideas (and possible concerns). She asks if the coaches & volunteers (which includes you) to:

- Describe 6 risks and hazards associated with sport participation (**P4**) explaining why they can cause injury or potential problems (**M3**)...making sure the risks and hazards include those associated with:
 - People (such as not doing a warm up)
 - Equipment (such as not wearing protective equipment)
 - Environment (such as the weather conditions)

You are keen to make sure your views are heard so decide to get down your ideas in advance of the meeting....

Task 2

The meeting went well, with loads of potential risks & hazards being discussed and debated.

In the end the Welfare Officer asks if anyone would be prepared to summarise the meeting – producing a detailed account of why participants are at risk of injury when taking part in sport **(D1)**

The Welfare Officer asks if you could prepare some material that the club could upload onto their website, so that other clubs can easily access it, although leaves the final decision to you - as long as the work reflects well on the club
