Sexism

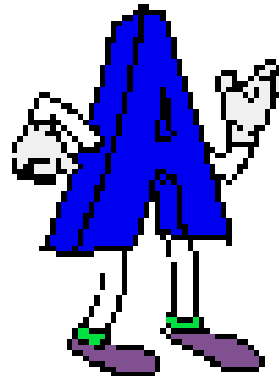

How are they marked?

Its SIMPLES...

1 mark for a simple explanation.

The (c) questions

Example:

Explain how a religious upbringing can lead to, or support, a belief in God.
(8 marks)

Christians usually teach their children to pray to God. This will make the children believe that God exists because otherwise their parent would not want them to pray to him.

2 marks given for a developed reason.

If God did not exist they and their parents would not waste their time praying to nothing. Also they may feel God presence (numinous) when they pray. They have been brought up to pray so they believe God exists.

4 marks given for further developing their first point and writing in clear English. 4 marks would also have been given for a second developed point.

Another feature of a Christian upbringing is going to church. When children go to church they see lot of people praying to God and worshipping his so they are bound to believe he exists.

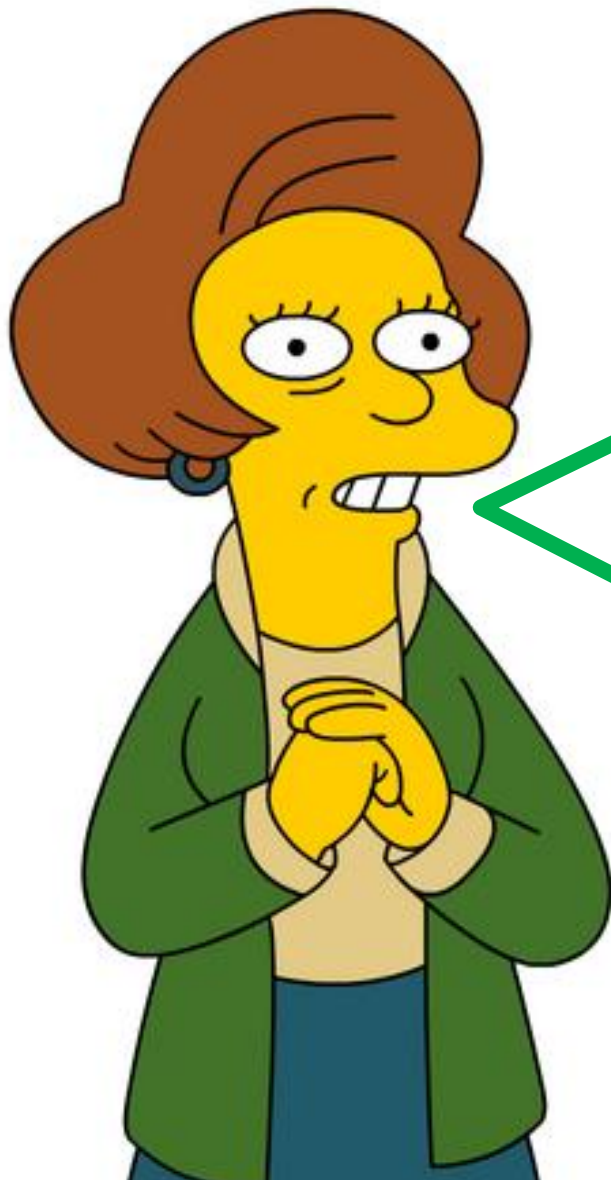
6 marks given for a further developed reason.

Many Christian parents also send their children to a church school. Here they will have RE lessons teaching them that Go exists and the children are likely to believe what the teachers tell them are true.

8 marks given for a further developed reason. Answer written in clear in English and includes key words (Church school, numinous)

Some Muslims think that men and women should not have equal rights because the Qur'an teaches that men and women are different. It says that men are stronger and their role is to protect women.

Some Muslims think men and women should be treated equal and have equal rights because it says in the Qur'an men and women are created equal. They have equal roles in bringing up the children and they are both able to work.



Choose one religion other than Christianity and explain why some of its followers agree with equal rights for women and some do not. (8 marks)

Muslims believe that men and women should have equal rights because it says in the Qur'an that Allah created everyone equally. They are both allowed to work and be educated equally.



Choose one religion other than Christianity and explain why some of its followers agree with equal rights for women and some do not. (8 marks)

Some Muslims believe that men and women should have different rights in life and religion because their holy book the Qur'an teaches that men should support and protect women. It teaches that men were created to be physically stronger and should therefore take this role.

The Qur'an also teaches that women have been created to have and bring up children. It is their role to do so and the man's role to provide for them. As a result only the men are required to attend the mosque for worship, women can worship at home.

Some Muslims believe that men and women should have equal rights because the Qur'an teaches that 'everyone is as equal as the teeth of a comb' meaning that everyone was created equally by Allah. They therefore should have equal rights in religion and education.

Also in Islam men and women are seen as being equally responsible for bringing up the children in the correct way. They are also both entitled to work, showing that they both have an equal responsibility.



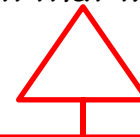
Choose one religion other than Christianity and explain why some of its followers agree with equal rights for women and some do not. (8 marks)

Some Christians think that men and women should be treated equally as it says in the bible that men and women were 'created in Gods image'. They therefore support women as church leaders and believe they should be given equal roles in worship and in life.

This is the view of modern Protestants who are in support of women church leaders. They believe that Jesus taught equality and that Christianity should move with the times and follow society in treating women as equals.

Other Christians look more to the teachings of St.Paul and believe that men and women are not equal. St Paul taught that women should 'be subject to there husbands as they are the lord', in other words women are there to serve men.

He also taught that women should 'remain silent in church' and as a result Roman Catholics and Traditional Protestants are against women church leaders as they feel it breaks with tradition. They also look to Jesus and the fact that he had no female disciples as an indication that women should not teach the word of God.
