The (a) questions

How are they marked?

Its SIMPLES...

These questions are for **2 marks** - you get **FULL** marks for a correct definition 😊.

If you give a definition that is **PARTLY** right you will get **ONE mark**.

Example:

What is paranormal? (2 marks)

Unexplained things that are thought to have a spiritual cause.

2 marks given for a correct definition

Unexplained things caused by ghosts.

1 mark given for a partly correct definition

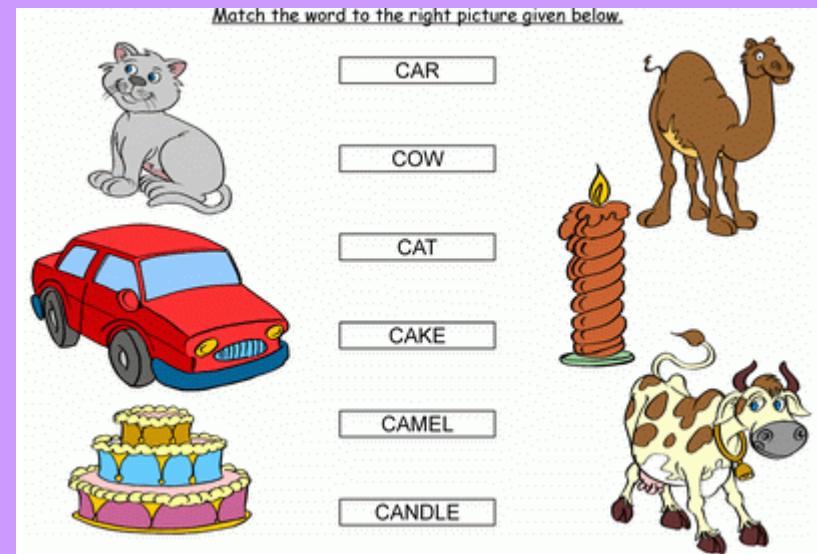

The (c) questions

These questions require you to explain religious teachings and beliefs about a topic we have studied. These questions are always worth **8 MARKS** each and contribute a large amount to your overall percentage - so you need to get these spot on!



The (c) questions

These type of questions are worth **8 marks**.

You get **2 marks** for a developed reason. Four developed reasons gets you **8 marks**.

Christians believe that life is a special gift from God because it says so in the Bible. So Roman Catholics would say abortion is always wrong because it's murder.

Explain how their beliefs about the Sanctity of Life affect what Christians believe about abortion (8 marks)

All Christians believe in the Sanctity of Life. This means that life is a gift from God and should be protected and respected. Christians also believe that only God is able to take back the gift of life and that all our lives have a purpose.

Because of this most Christians say that abortion is wrong because you are ending a life without God's permission. Roman Catholics are really strict and don't allow it at all; Church of England will allow it in some cases where it is the lesser of two evils.


Were the reasons developed?

Explain how their beliefs about the Sanctity of Life affect what Christians believe about abortion (8 marks)

Roman Catholics don't believe that abortion is ever right. They think it is murder and the Bible says "Thou shalt not kill". They believe this is true even if the life of the mother is at risk because they say that the life of the foetus is equal to the life of the mother because God has a purpose for every life.

The Church of England are not as strict. They still think abortion is wrong, but there are some circumstances where they will allow it such as rape or where the baby will be severely handicapped. This is because having an abortion would be less wrong than having the baby and this is called the lesser of two evils.

Explain how their beliefs about the Sanctity of Life affect what Christians believe about abortion (8 marks)

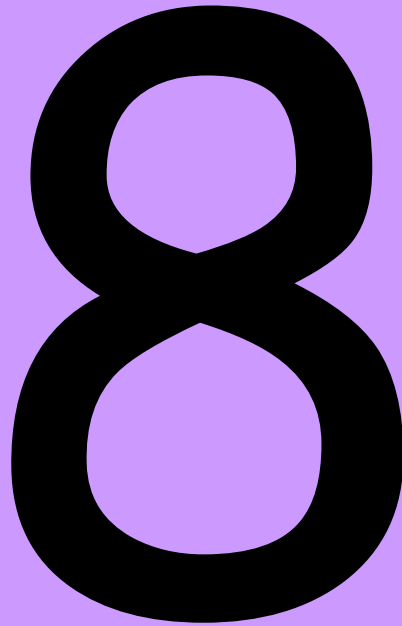
The sanctity of life is a Christian belief that life is precious and comes from God.

This means that only God can give life and take life away, and also that all life has a purpose that only God knows. Christians believe this because the Bible says that human beings are created in God's image and that we are more valuable to God than sparrows.

Roman Catholics follow this teaching very strictly. They believe that life begins at conception and so abortion is murder because you are trying to end a life that is not yours to end; also the Bible says "Thou shall not kill". They also believe that there is no circumstance when abortion is OK, even if the life of the mother is at risk. This is because they believe God is in charge and knows the purpose of our lives.

The Church of England are not as strict. They still believe that abortion is wrong because life should be protected but they also believe in the "lesser of two evils". This is where having the baby would be a worse decision for the baby or the mother than having an abortion so an abortion is the most loving thing to do. The circumstances that the Church of England will allow an abortion are following rape, if the mothers life is at risk or if the baby is going to be severely handicapped.

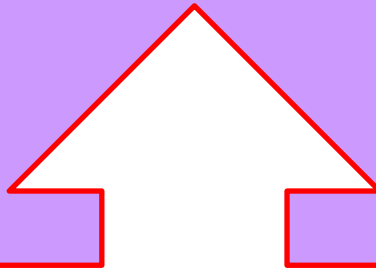

Structure is important but depends on the question.

If the question asks you to contrast the beliefs of two different Christian groups, then split your reasons to 2 and 2.

If the question asks how a teaching would then affect how a believer acts, then a 1 and 3 split or a 2 and 2 split might be appropriate.
