Materials

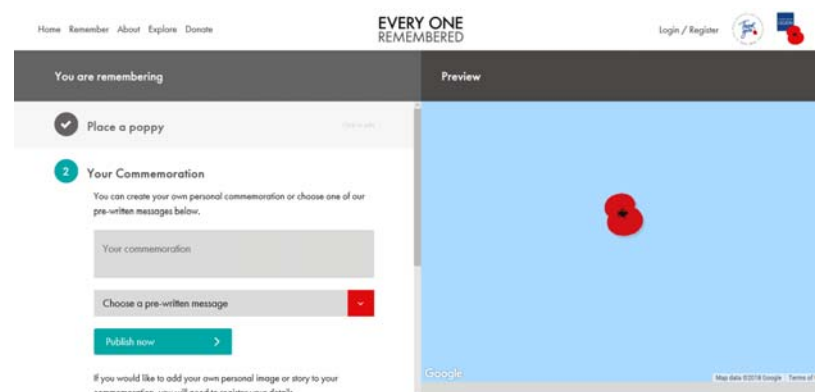
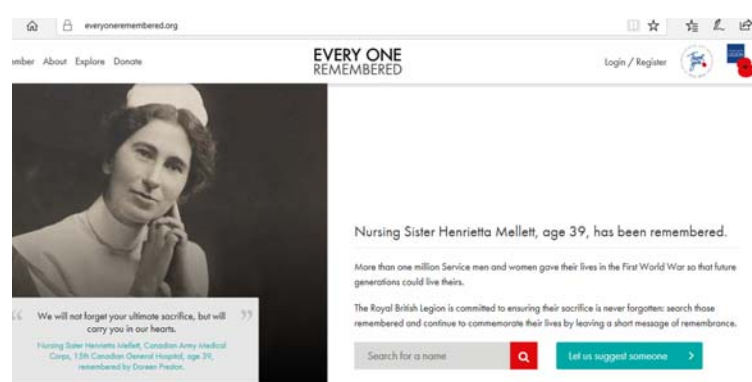
You can make your poppy out of anything you like. There are some good videos on the internet to show you how. Some ideas include;

If you know of a service man or woman who died in World War One, or have found a local person on the Clements Hall website, you can search for their name. If you don't, click the "Let us suggest someone" button and the website will choose a service man or woman who has not yet had a message of remembrance. When you have selected the person to remember, write a personal message in the grey box. Explain that the person is being remembered as part of a poppy display at Millthorpe School in York. Add your name if you wish and click "Publish now"



On your finished poppy, write or add a label with the name of the service man or woman who you have remembered.

- It can be any size
- You can make more than one
- It must be handed in to Miss Frankland or in the collection box in D8 by Friday 26th October to be included in our display
