Options after Year 11

Your child has completed a careers questionnaire, which is used to identify the best package of careers support. They may be invited to a group session in Year 10, linked to their career interest and covering some broad tips about career planning and future options. Individual careers appointments will be offered in Year 11.

- College
- Apprenticeship

A range of short videos, activities and worksheets. Each is designed to take about an hour to complete. It is possible to simply browse through the videos to get an insight into a range of career areas.

A selection of different career areas to choose from, mainly professional areas, including Teaching, Law, Veterinary, TV and Media, Graphic Design, Finance.

A student can sign in themselves, or you can sign in as a parent to see what is available.

Courses often last for 2 weeks, requiring about 10 hours per week. Some starting on 1st June have an application deadline of 24th May.
